

# PHOTOSHOP MEASURE TOOL

If the horizon in an image is sloping, it can easily be corrected using Photoshop's Measure Tool:

- Select the **Measure Tool**, also called the **Ruler Tool** in some versions of Photoshop, from the **Tool Box**. You will find it under the **Eyedropper Tool**.
- Using the **Measure Tool**, **Left Click** on one end of the line that you want to be horizontal in the image and, keeping the mouse clicked down, follow the line through to the other end and **Release**.
- Now go to **Image > Rotate Canvas > Arbitrary**. The dialogue box will display the angle and direction, CW or CCW, which is needed to rotate the canvas by to level the horizon. Confirm this by clicking **OK**.
- There will now be white areas in the corners where the image has been rotated. This can be fixed by either **Cropping** them off or **Cloning** them out.

**This method also works with vertical lines as well**
