PHOTOSHOP MEASURE TOOL

If the horizon in an image is sloping, it can easily be corrected using Photoshop's Measure Tool:

- Select the **Measure Tool**, also called the **Ruler Tool** in some versions of Photoshop, from the **Tool Box**. You will find it under the **Eyedropper Tool**.
- Using the Measure Tool, Left Click on one end of the line that you want to be horizontal in the image and, keeping the mouse clicked down, follow the line through to the other end and Release.
- Now go to Image > Rotate Canvas > Arbitrary. The dialogue box will display
 the angle and direction, CW or CCW, which is needed to rotate the canvas by to
 level the horizon. Confirm this by clicking OK.
- There will now be white areas in the corners where the image has been rotated. This can be fixed by either **Cropping** them off or **Cloning** them out.

This method also works with vertical lines as well
